RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS RULES AND REGULATIONS - UNLIMITED

ITEM 60

PAYMENT OF CHARGES

Customer shall be liable for payments of the transportation charges accruing on a shipment and nothing herein shall limit the rights of the SCXF to require at time of movement, shipment of delivery the prepayment or guarantee of charges, unless Customer has entered into an agreement for credit with the SCXF. Customer will pay SCXF immediately upon presentation of a bill therefor by SCXF. If charges have not been prepaid, or customer has not entered into an agreement for credit with SCXF, SCXF shall not make delivery of the shipment without payment or guarantee by shipper or consignee of all charges.

Acceptance of shipment by Customer shall be deemed acceptance of responsibility for payment of all charges accruing on the shipment, including, but not limited to demurrage, switching and all other charges that may be applicable. Such payment shall be in U. S. money and cannot be reduced to offset claims, damages to property, or for any other reasons.

FINANCE CHARGES: The SCXF will assess a finance charge of 1.5% per month (18% per annum) on unpaid bills, including, without limitation, demurrage, switching and all other charges which are not paid within credit period. The finance charge continues to accrue daily until payment is received by SCXF.

If SCXF, at its sole discretion, uses a collection agency or attorneys to collect delinquent bills for freight or other charges and SCXF is successful in collecting such charges, Customers shall reimburse SCXF for all reasonable collection costs, including reasonable collection agency fees and reasonable attorneys' fees.

RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS RULES AND REGULATIONS – UNLIMITED

ITEM 75

SECURITY DEPOSIT

For Customers who have established credit with the SCXF, a deposit to secure payment of any freight, demurrage, storage, detention, switching or other accessorial charge that may accrue will be required from such customer who has failed to pay demurrage, storage, detention, switching or other accessorial charges when due under applicable laws and regulations. (Customers as referred to herein shall mean any and all consignors, consignees, beneficial owners or other responsible parties).

The deposit must be paid before any freight car or trailer is delivered to such customer for loading or unloading.

The minimum deposit for each freight car will be the average amount per freight car demurrage, detention, storage, switching or other accessorial charges outstanding at the time this tariff provision is invoked against Customer. The maximum amount of deposit will be determined by this railroad's credit office or through other alternative forms of security. The credit office may waive the minimum deposit per car by accepting a revolving deposit of \$1,000.00 to \$50,000.00 based on traffic volume. The deposit will be held in an escrow account to guarantee payment of and to be applied against any switching, demurrage, detention, storage or other accessorial charges which may accrue since the implementation of the security deposit arrangement.

SCXF will refund the deposit or balance of the deposit within thirty (30) days after notification by its agents that the equipment has been released to SCXF. Any switching, demurrage, detention, storage or other accessorial charges will be deducted from the deposits before any refunds are made. The deposit or balance of the deposit may be transferable to another freight car to cover charges incurred since the implementation of the security deposit arrangement.

Security deposit will no longer be required after the Customer has paid all outstanding switching, demurrage, detention, storage and other accessorial charges and has given assurance in writing to the satisfaction of SCXF 's credit office that future switching, demurrage, detention, storage and other accessorial charges will be paid within the credit period.

SECTION 1 MISCELLANEOUS RULES AND CHARGES

ITEM 110

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Shipments of Hazardous Materials will not be accepted in interchange unless prior arrangements have been made with SCXF.

ITEM 120

CARS INTERCHANGED IN ERROR

A charge of \$300.00 per car will be assessed to delivering carriers on all cars interchanged to the SCXF in error.

ITEM 130

EMPTY CARS ORDERED BUT NOT LOADED

On empty cars that are ordered for loading and order is canceled and car is in route, or the service of switching or placing of car has been performed and the car is not loaded but returned to this railroad empty, a charge of \$250.00 per car will be assessed and collected from the person, firm or corporation ordering such cars. (See Note, this item).

Note – Charge will not apply on cars unfit for loading. (See Item 135, this tariff).

ITEM 135

IMPROPER CARS FURNISHED FOR LOADING BY CONNECTING LINES

When cars ordered by industries for loading are refused on account of not being in proper condition to load, a charge of \$500.00 per car will be assessed against the railroad furnishing the car.

ITEM 145

PERISHABLES

The SCXF does not provide protective service. Perishable freight under protective service will be accepted from connecting railroad for delivery to Customers with the understanding that protective service is not provided by the SCXF and the SCXF accepts no liability for any loss or damage resulting from failure of such protective service.

SECTION 1 MISCELLANEOUS RULES AND CHARGES

[C] ITEM 150

TURNING OF CARS TO PERMIT LOADING OR UNLOADING, ETC.

If cars are turned at request of customer to facilitate loading or unloading, or for any other purpose, a charge of \$300.00 per car per occurrence will be assessed and will be in addition to all other applicable charges. (See Note, this item).

Note – Charge will not apply to properly placarded *rail*cars.

[C] ITEM 160

SPECIAL FREIGHT TRAIN SERVICE

Special Freight Train Service is the movement of a train in other than normal freight train service at the specific request of the shipper or consignee, or as may be required due to other conditions outside normal train operations.

The change for special freight train or switching service will be \$500.00 per hour, subject to a minimum of \$2,000.00 per occurrence, and will be in addition to all other *applicable tariff* charges associated with the movement.

Charges to be calculated from the time the crew and locomotive report for special service until the return of crew and locomotive to starting point.

(This railroad reserves the right to restrict or modify any request for special freight train service).

ITEM 170

STANDBY SERVICE

When the SCXF's locomotive and crew are held at the request of an industry or delayed by an industry within the confines of the industry or immediately adjacent thereto, the charge for such standby or delay shall be \$500 per hour subject to a minimum of four hours. Such charges shall be in addition to other published charges, if any, applicable to cars delayed or handled.

SECTION 1 MISCELLANEOUS RULES AND CHARGES

[C] ITEM 180

OVERLOADED CARS

Cars found to be overloaded will be subject to the following addition charges:

- \$300.00 per car When a car is discovered to be overloaded at loading point or within the confines of the industry. Charge to be assessed consignor.
- (2) \$500.00 per car when a car is discovered to be overloaded beyond loading point or confines of the industry. Charge to be assessed consignor.

(It will be the responsibility of the consignor to adjust the lading at their own expense sufficient to eliminate the overload condition).

(3) \$500.00 per car – When a car is received in interchange from connections and is found to be overloaded, such car will be returned to delivering carrier for adjustment to lading to eliminate the overload condition. Charge to be assessed by delivering carrier.

SECTION 2 [C] SWITCHING CHARGES

ITEM 200

DEFINITION OF INTRA-PLANT SWITCHING

Intra-plant switching movement from one track to another within the same plant or industry, or from one location to another location on the same track within the same plant or industry.

ITEM 210

DEFINITION OF INTRA-TERMINAL SWITCHING

Intra-terminal switching is a switching movement (other than intra-plant switching) from one private or assigned track to another private or assigned track of the same railroad, within the switching limits of same station or industrial switching district.

[A] ITEM 215 DEFINITION OF INTER-TERMINAL SWITCHING

A switching movement between one subdivision and another subdivision within the SCXF, when such movement is not part of the initial revenue freight charge.

For a list of subdivisions, please see page 12 of this tariff.

ITEM 220

INTRA-PLANT SWITCHING CHARGE

The SCXF will perform intra-plant switching at a charge of \$150.00 per car.

ITEM 230

INTRA-TERMINAL SWITCHING CHARGE

The SCXF will perform intra-terminal switching at a charge of \$300.00 per car.

[A] ITEM 240

INTER-TERMINAL SWITCHING CHARGE

The SCXF will perform inter-terminal switching at a charge of \$1,500.00 per car.

SECTION 3 CAR DEMURRAGE AND CHARGES

APPLICATION

Except where provided to the contrary, Demurrage Rules and Charges contained herein apply to all railroad and privately owned cars held for by consignors and consignees for any purpose.

[C] ITEM 300

HOLIDAYS

The SCXF does not operate on the following Holidays:

New Year's Day – January 1 Martin Luther King Jr. Day - Third Monday of January Good Friday – (See Note 2) Memorial Day – Last Monday of May Independence Day – July 4 (See Note 1) Labor Day – First Monday of September Veterans Day – November 11 (See Note 1) Thanksgiving Day – Fourth Thursday of November Day after Thanksgiving Day – Fourth Friday of November Day before Christmas Day – December 24 Christmas Day – December 25 Floating Holiday – Ist workday immediately adjacent to the day that the Independence Day holiday is celebrated.

Wherever reference is made to "holidays", it shall mean only the days listed above.

[C] Note 1 – When this *holiday* occurs on a Sunday, the following Monday will be observed as the holiday. *When this date occurs on a Saturday, the previous Friday will be observed as the holiday. Note 2 - The date Good Friday is observed changes annually.* ITEM 310

ACTUAL PLACEMENT

Actual placement is made when a car is placed in an accessible position for loading or unloading or at a point previously designated by the consignor or consignee.

SECTION 3 CAR DEMURRAGE AND CHARGES

[C] ITEM 320

CONSTRUCTIVE PLACEMENT

When a car consigned or ordered to a private track, industrial interchange track or other-than-public-delivery track cannot be actually placed because of a condition attributable to the consignor or consignee, such car will be held at available hold point and notice shall be sent or given the consignor or consignee that the car is being held and that this railroad is unable to effect placement, however, if car is placed on private track, industrial interchange track or otherthan-public delivery track serving the consignor or consignee, the car will be considered constructively placed without notice.

Applicable *tariff* charges will apply. [C] ITEM 330

FREE TIME

Free time as follows will be allowed for each car.

Forty-eight (48) hours to complete unloading.

Forty-eight (48) hours to complete loading.

Free time will be computed from the first 7:00 AM after placement, whether constructive or actual, or after notification has been sent or given where required.

No free time will be provided to hazardous materials cars or heavy-duty freight cars.

[A] THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS DEFINE AND GOVERN THE PROVISIONS OUTLINED IN THIS TARIFF.

ACTUAL PLACEMENT – When a car(s) is placed in an accessible position for loading or unloading or, at a point designated by the consignor or consignee.

CONSIGNEE – The party to whom a shipment is consigned, or other entity or person as described in 49 CFE Part 1333, including but not limited to "Care-of-Party, unloader, warehouseman or transloader.

CONSIGNOR – The party in whose name a car(s) is ordered; the party who furnishes forwarding directions or other entity or person as described in 49 CFR Part 1333, including but not limited to "Care of-Party", unloader, warehouseman or transloader.

CONSTRUCTIVE PLACEMENT – When, due to some disability on the part of the consignor or consignee, a car cannot be placed for loading or unloading and is placed elsewhere, it is considered as being under constructive placement and subject to demurrage rules and charges, the same as if it were actually placed at the designated point.

CUSTOMER – The consignor, loader, consignee, unloader, or other party who is responsible for the payment of demurrage, detention, or other charges specified in this Tariff.

DEMURRAGE DAY – A twenty-four (24) hour period (calendar day), or part thereof, commencing 0701 after tender.

DISPOSITION – Information, including forwarding instructions or release, that allows the railroad to either tender or release the car(s) from the consignor's or consignee's account.

DIVERSION – An order provided by the consignor instructing that a car(s) be delivered to a location other than the one indicated on the original forwarding instructions.

EMPTY CAR(S) ORDERED AND NOT USED – Empty car(s), placed for loading as ordered, and subsequently released without being used in transportation service.

EMPTY RELEASE INFORMATION – Advice provided by the consignee to authorized personnel, that the car(s) is unloaded and available. This information must include the identity of the consignee, party furnishing information, and the car(s) initial and number.

FORWARDING INSTRUCTIONS – Shipping instructions provided at the point of loading that contain all of the necessary information to transport the shipment to its final destination.

THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS DEFINE AND GOVERN THE PROVISIONS OUTLINED IN THIS TARIFF.

LEASE TRACK – Track(s) assigned to a user through a written agreement. Lease tracks will be treated the same as private tracks.

LINE-HAUL – This Tariff defines Line-Haul transportation as the movement of one or more railcars(s) from station to station: the pulling of the railcars(s) from the origin and placement of the railcar(s) at the destination: and includes the movement of an empty car back to its origin or another specified destination if such return movement occurs within six months of the most recent outbound, loaded move.

LOADING – The complete or partial loading of a car(s) in conformity with loading and clearance rules and, the furnishing of forwarding instructions.

LOCAL SERVICE – A movement of traffic originating at one point and destined to another point on the switching carrier.

LOADED CAR(S) – A car(s) that is completely or partially loaded.

NOTIFICATION – When required, written notification will be furnished to the parties entitled to receive notice that the car(s) is available for loading, unloading, or otherwise impacted by demurrage provisions.

ORDER DATE – The date that the consignor requests empty car(s) to be furnished for loading.

OTHER THAN PUBLIC DELIVERY TRACK – Any trackage assigned for individual use, including privately owned or leased tracks.

PARTIAL UNLOADING – The partial unloading of a car(s) and furnishing of the proper forwarding or handling instructions.

PRICE LIST – the rates set forth herein, including but not limited to the rates set forth in Item 3110, Item 3115, and Item 6400.

PRIVATE CAR(S) – A car(s) bearing other than railroad reporting marks that is not railroad-controlled.

PRIVATE TRACK – Tracks that are not owned or leased by the railroad.

PUBLIC DELIVERY TRACK – Track that is open to the general public for loading and unloading.

RAILROAD-CONTROLLED CAR(S) – A car(s) bearing other than railroad reporting marks that is either leased or controlled by a railroad.

THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS DEFINE AND

THIS TARIFF, CONTINUED FROM PREVIOUS PAGE.

RECONSIGNMENT – An order provided by consignor to bill a car(s) to other than the original consignee. (An order to turn over the car(s) to another party that does not require any additional movement of the car(s) is not a reconsignment). REFUSED LOADED CAR(S) – When the original loaded car(s) is refused at destination without being unloaded.

RELOADING – When a car(s) is held for loading after being released as an empty.

RELEASE – Date and time that the railroad receives notification that the car is empty or that forwarding instructions are received.

RESHIPMENT – A new document by which the entire original shipment is forwarded in the same car(s) to another destination.

SCXF – Refers to the South Central Florida Express, Inc., also known as SCFE, a common carrier.

SERVING YARD – A classification yard where the local train serving the customer originates.

SHIPPER ASSIGNED CAR(S) – Specific empty car(s) assigned to a particular shipper for their exclusive use.

STOPPED IN TRANSIT – When a car(s) is held en route due to any condition attributable to the consignor, consignee, or owner.

SUBDIVISION - A portion of a division/service lane/business unit designated by timetable.

TENDER – The notification, actual or constructive placement, of an empty or loaded car(s).

TIH/PIH – Toxic Inhalation Hazard/Poisonous Inhalation Hazard

TIME – Local time is applicable and is expressed on the basis of the 24-hour clock. *Example: 12:01 AM is expressed as 0001 Hours.*

UNLOADING – The complete unloading of a car(s), and the advice received from the consignee that the car(s) is empty and available to the railroad.
